As an archaeologist who has excavated at nearby Oplontis and led many tours to the Roman sites around Pompeii, and as an ancient historian who has studied the texts from the first century, I can take you on a virtual tour that will inspire you with a very real sense of what Roman life was truly like. Mass entertainment, trade, religion, playboy mansions, imperial homes, they're all here in the amphitheatre at volcanic Pozzuoli, the religious site of Cumae (made so famous by the Roman poet, Virgil), the emperor's wife's superbly decorated glamorous house at Oplontis and the next door work-a-day wine warehouse on the ancient shore, as well as the party houses at Stabiae, the markets and the rich finds housed in Naples' Archaeological Museum.
